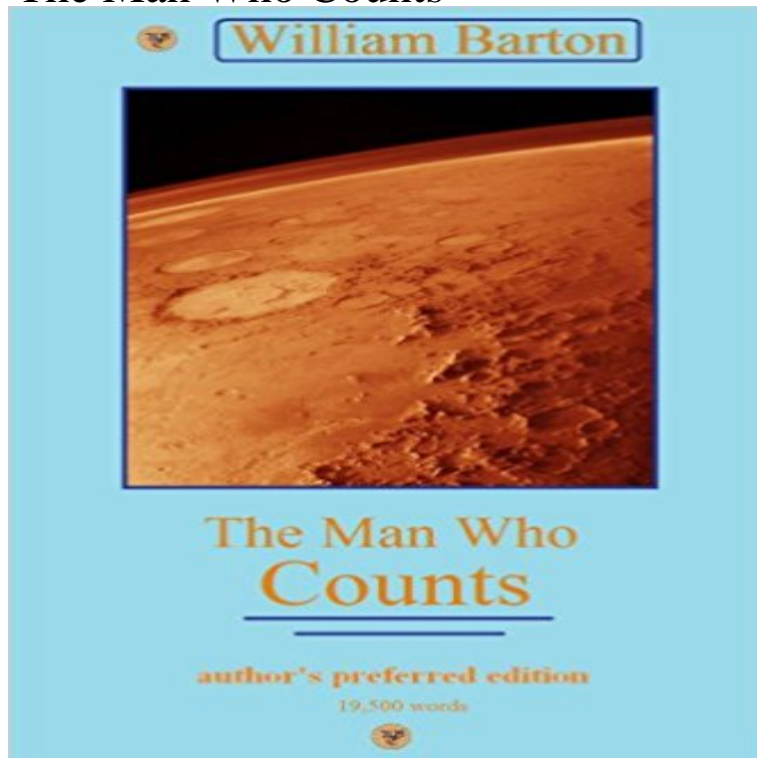


The Man Who Counts
