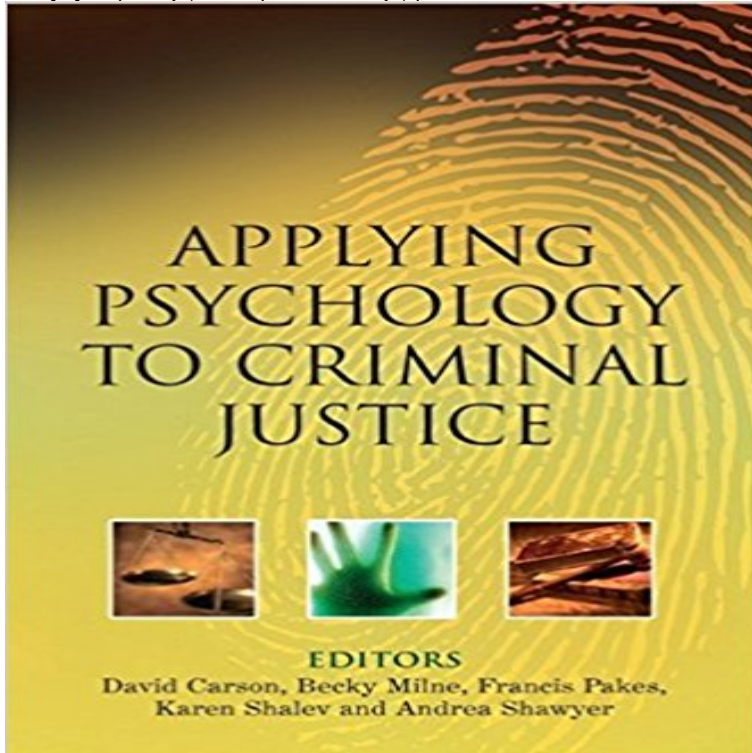


Applying Psychology to Criminal Justice
